## Preamble

Mining, Geological and Metallurgical Institute of India (MGMI), established way back on 16th January 1906, is an internationally acclaimed professional body and is one of the oldest institutions of its kind in the world. Since inception, it has been working to promote and advance the mining, mineral and allied industries. The Asian Mining Congress (AMC) and International Mining Exhibition (IME), held concurrently, are biennial international events organized by MGMI. These flagship events provide ample opportunities to all stakeholders including practising engineers, machinery manufacturers, planners, regulators, academicians, scientists and policy makers, for sharing their knowledge, experience and expertise and exhibit their products that can benefit the mining and mineral industries, not only in the Asian region but also globally.

The first AMC and IME were held in January 2006 to commemorate MGMI centenary. Since then, the Asian Mining Congress and International Mining Exhibition (IME) are being held regularly at Kolkata simultaneously. The last edition, 10th AMC and IME were held in November 2023. There was wonderful response to each of these events with the participation of a large number of delegates from India and abroad. Useful contributions by experts from Asian countries including Bangladesh, China, Indonesia, Iran, Mongolia, Oman, Nepal, Pakistan, Russia, Thailand, Turkey etc. besides the Indian Mineral Industries boosted the events. The conference proceedings were further enriched with valuable articles and addresses from eminent professionals from Australia, Canada, France, Germany, Poland, South Africa, Sweden, UK and USA.

The **11th Asian Mining Congress and International Mining Exhibition** will be held during **October 30- 31, 2025 in J W Marriott, Kolkata**. For this conference, invitations are being extended to all stakeholders in Indian Mineral and Equipment industry along with all mineral-rich Asian countries for active participation. Other countries, which have made significant advancements in the evolution of the best mining practices and technological innovations, are also being requested to participate.

## Background

Combating the menace of climate change, implementing energy transition and living up to strong societal expectations are serious concerns.

Strangely, the mining activities remain enigmatic to the society, though mining footprints are omnipresent in most of our household items as well as in many technological breakthroughs. Thus, the Mining Sector in particular and the Mineral Sector at large have to be more responsible and responsive to make their contribution to nation-building more visible.

In this backdrop, it is very important for the stakeholders to brainstorm for working out the best practices that would recognise them as responsible entrepreneurs. Hence, the theme of the 11th AMC is kept as **“Innovative & Responsible Mining for Inclusive Growth”**. 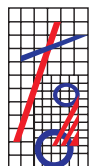

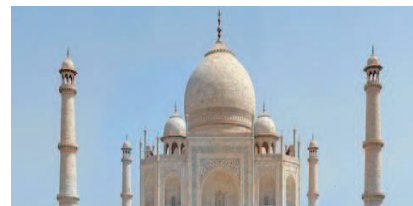

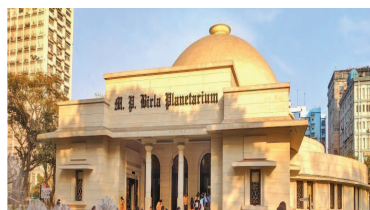
## India: The Host Country

It has more than 7600 km long beautiful coastline, which attracts tourists round the year. India has a civilization which is more than 5000 years old. ## Kolkata: The Host City

Academic and Research Institutes on Mining like Indian Institute of Technology (IIT-ISM) Dhanbad, Indian Institute of Engineering Science and Technology (IIST), Shibpur, Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Kharagpur, CSIR-Central Institute of Mining and Fuel Research (CSIR-CIMFR), Dhanbad, Directorate General of Mines Safety (DGMS), Dhanbad etc. are all located within a radius of 250 km distance from Kolkata.

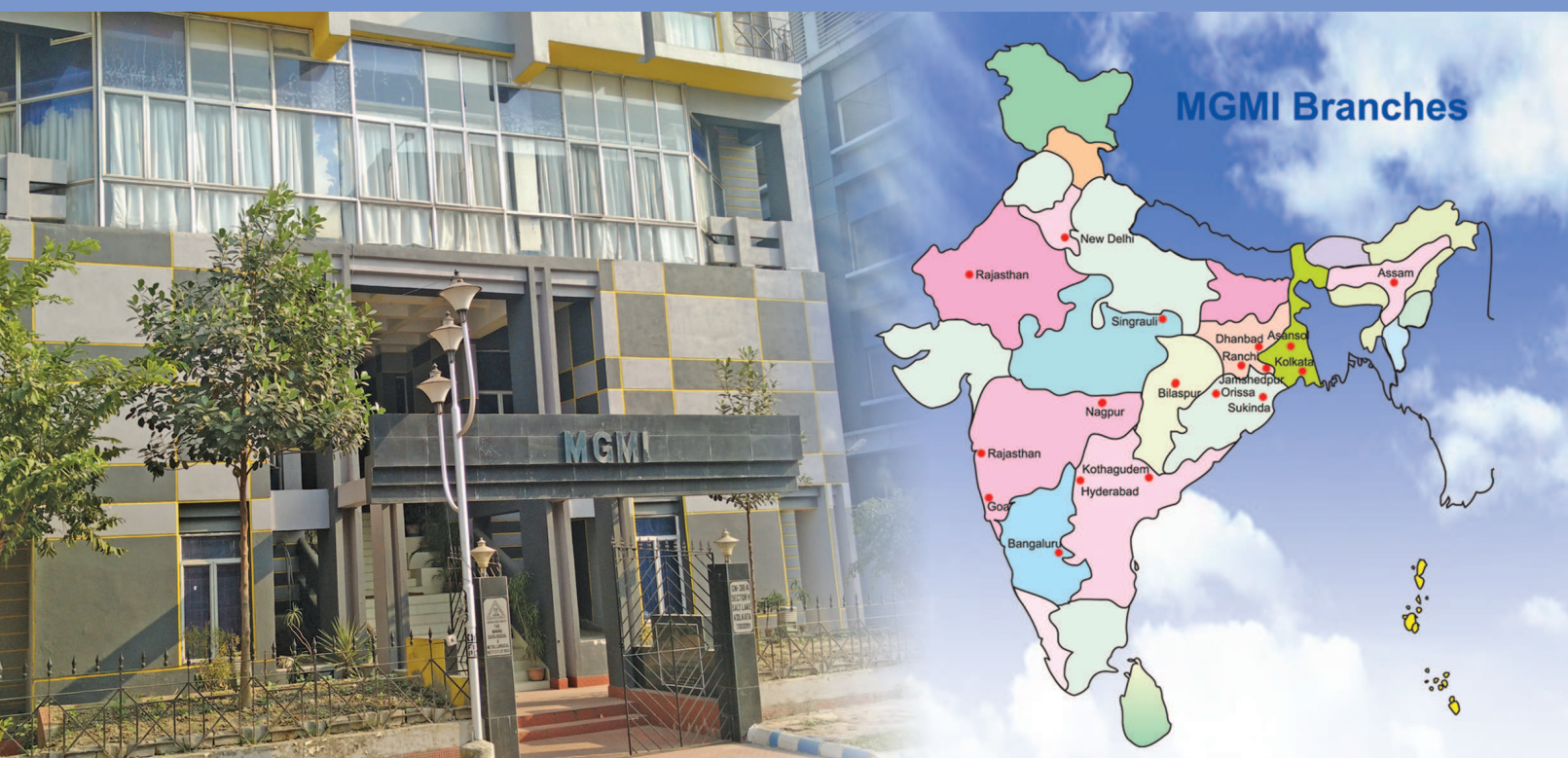
