Preamble

The Mining, Geological and Metallurgical Institute of India (MGMI), established way back on **16th January 1906**, is an internationally acclaimed professional body and is one of the oldest institutions of this kind in the world. Since inception, it has been working to promote and advance the mining and mineral industries. The **Asian Mining Congress (AMC)** and **International Mining Exhibition (IME)**, held concurrently, are flagship international events organized by MGMI biennially. These events provide ample opportunities to all stakeholders including practicing engineers, machinery manufacturers, planners, regulators, academicians, scientists and policy makers, for sharing their knowledge, experience and expertise and exhibit their products that can benefit the mining and mineral industries in the Asian region in particular and rest of the world at large.

The first AMC and Exhibition were held in January 2006 to commemorate the centenary of MGMI. The 2nd AMC was held in January 2008, the 3rd in January 2010, the 4th in January 2012, the 5th in February 2014, the 6th in February 2016, the 7th in November 2017 and the 8th in November 2019. There were very good responses worldwide in each event with participation of around 600 delegates from India and abroad. Useful contributions were made by the experts from Asian countries including Bangladesh, China, Indonesia, Iran, Mongolia, Oman, Nepal, Pakistan, Russia, Thailand, Turkey etc. besides the Indian Mineral Industries. The conference proceedings were further enriched by valuable contributions of eminent professionals from Australia, Canada, France, Germany, Poland, South Africa, Sweden, UK and USA.

The **9th Asian Mining Congress** and **International Mining Exhibition**, in this sequel, will be held during the period **15th** - **18th February 2022**, in **Kolkata**. In this conference, invitations are extended to all Asian mineral rich countries for active participation. Other countries, who have made significant contributions in evolving best mining practices and technological advancements are also requested to participate.

Background

The Asian region is a significant producer of metal ores and metal; the production of some major metal commodities accounts for more than one-half of the world's total. This region also produces more than 65% of global production. Asia-Pacific is the largest coal mining market with almost 75% of it being done within the region. China, Australia and India are the global leaders in production of coal, which is used for many essential activities like power generation and steel production. With vast area and wide diversity of geological set-up in Asia, it is likely that every kind of deposit is present in this continent. Therefore, the Asian countries play an important role in strategizing future mining activities in the world. Nevertheless, environmental concerns, which are global phenomenon, cannot be ignored.

In this backdrop, the congress will provide a forum to promote and advance techno-scientific cooperation towards national and international progress in the areas of mineral production, in addition to the development of new opportunities of sustainable business that will benefit both Asian and global communities.
